



2018 North Carolina Senior Games Golf Tournament

2018 USGA RULES of Golf, NCSG Rules Book and the local rules on this sheet govern play. Pairings for day 1 are based on Local Games qualifying scores. Only registered participants are allowed on carts. Spectators and caddies are not permitted on the courses.

TEES:

Reynolds: Men 50-79 black tees
Men 80+ & Women red tees
Salem Glen: Men 50-79 green tees
Men 80 + & Women red tees

RANGE BALLS are provided

DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE: If you are doubtful of your rights or the correct procedure, you may play a second ball under Rule 3-3 and report the facts to the Committee upon completion of the round.

PACE OF PLAY: The pace of play standard is 14 and ½ minutes per hole (4 hours & 21 minutes).

SUSPENSION OF PLAY: Suspension of play will be signaled by consecutive siren blasts. If a player has started play of a hole, he may discontinue play immediately or continue play of the hole, provided he does so without delay, Rule 6-8b. **Suspension of play due to a dangerous situation** will be signaled by one prolonged siren blast and play must be discontinued immediately.

PREFERRED LIES: Players are permitted to lift, clean, and place their ball within one club length of where it originally lay in their own fairway only.

WATER HAZARDS: Regular water hazards are identified by yellow stakes and defined by yellow lines. Lateral water hazards are identified by red stakes and defined by red lines. Salem Glen hole 10 hazard, provisional acceptable.

EMBEDDED BALL: Relief may be taken “through the green”.

Obstructions: **Gravel roads, railroad ties and landscape stones** are considered immovable obstructions. Ropes and stakes are movable obstructions.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR: Defined by white lines.

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS: **Greenside Fans and Festival of Light Displays** are deemed to be temporary immovable obstructions (TIO's). See page 147 of the 2016 Rules of Golf for interference and relief procedure.

MEASURING DEVICES: A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only.

SCORECARD: A scorecard is deemed returned when the score is posted on the scoreboard. Scorecards must be signed by the marker and the competitor.
